Situation Overview

Isolated Severe Storms Possible Today and Tomorrow
Severe storms most likely late morning into the evening

Issued May 25, 2022 4:00 AM ET

Threats

- Isolated Damaging Wind Gusts up to 60 mph.
- Heavy Rainfall and Frequent Lightning.
- Hail, some of which could be quarter sized.
- A brief tornado cannot be ruled out Thursday across the west.

1 - MARGINAL (MRGL)
Isolated severe thunderstorms possible

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Severe Weather Outlook

- Isolated strong to severe storms possible Wednesday & Thursday
- Main threats: damaging wind gusts and quarter-size hail.
- A brief tornado or two cannot be ruled out on Thursday.
- Timing of storms: can occur at any time, but the best potential is late morning into the evening.
- Heavy rainfall is also a concern. Localized flooding may occur.

Probability of excessive rainfall leading to rapid onset flooding.*

- High Risk At least 70%
- Moderate Risk At least 40%
- Slight Risk At least 15%
- Marginal Risk At least 5%

* Within 25 miles of a point.
May not represent localized flooding threat over burn scars.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook

- Multiple rounds of scattered to numerous showers and storms through Thursday.
- Slight Risk (level 2 of 4) for excessive rainfall over the FL Panhandle, southeast AL, and portions of southwest GA on Thursday.
- Flash flooding is possible.
- Minor nuisance flooding elsewhere in urban, low-lying, and poor-drainage areas.
